Cross-Utilization of Coursework Among REBE Programs

Note: The Online Executive MS-REBE degree, and the on-campus MS-REBE degree entail meeting distinct and separate admission criteria for each program. Students accepted into one program may only apply 16 credits of coursework toward another program (with prior permission from an REBE advisor and the Director of the Burns School). In order to graduate from either the Executive MS-REBE or the on-campus MS-REBE, students will be responsible for meeting all degree requirements for that particular program, and for completing all but 16 hours of coursework in the corresponding course format.
