Staff Accountant. Staff accountants work with the day-to-day finances of an organization. This includes responsibility for everything from financial statements and reconciliations to expense reports and accruals to general ledger activity, fund allocation, and much more.

Advisory Associate. Advisory associates are the problem-solvers and fact-finders of the accounting world. They help manage risk and business performance and advise companies on how to improve their bottom line.

Assurance Associate. The key responsibility of assurance associates is verifying that the financial information companies release to the public accurately depicts their financial status.

Audit Associate. Audit associates are charged with auditing companies cash, receivables, inventory, assets, payrolls, expenses, etc. Their job is to make sure that companies are accurately tracking their costs and expenses.

Tax Associate. A tax associate works hand-in-hand with their clients to ensure proper preparation of taxes. They often develop particular specialties for one realm of tax accounting such as federal, state, international, etc. and use their niche role to assist a variety of organizations.

Controller. The controller is the person who prepares financial portfolio reports for organizations. They analyze the current balance and compare the company's financial status across time. Controllers are also responsible for carefully budgeting for each of the company's assets.

Business Valuation Analyst. Valuation analysts put the price tag on business. They are charged with gathering and evaluating an organization's data to determine how much the company is worth – insight that plays a key role in how companies are managed, traded and sold.

Financial Analyst. Financial Analysts are responsible for the accuracy of company financial statements. They often play a key role in working with outside parties to help the company achieve its financial goals.

Corporate Finance Management Associate. Finance management associates work with models and analyses to advise companies on profitable business strategies while reporting on financial information and using it to forecast future trends.
