## "Bite the Bullet"

#### Meaning:

#### Origin:

"Bite the bullet" has its origins in the military. During the Civil War, doctors typically used alcohol such as whiskey to numb patients' pain while operating. If they ran out of this liquid "pain killer," they would give the patient a bullet instead, instructing them to put it in their mouth and bite down hard, thus focusing their energy on their mouth and distracting them from the pain.
